The Cub Scout Promise (pg 29):

I, [say your own name], promise to do my best
To do my duty to God and my country,
To help other people, and
To Obey the Law of the Pack

The Law of the Pack (pg 31):

The Cub Scout follows Akela.
The Cub Scout helps the pack go.
The pack helps the Cub Scout grow.
The Cub Scout gives goodwill

The Cub Scout Sign (page 32):

Two parts—“to help other people” and to “Obey the Law of the Pack.” The fingers raised are like the sharp ears of the wolf ready to listen to Akela.

The Cub Scout Motto (pg 33):

Do Your Best. A motto is a rule for living. Do your best all the time. Do Your best in school and at home. Do your best when yo play a game and help your team.

The Cub Scout Handshake (pg 33):

The two fingers along the inside of the other boy’s wrist means that you help and that you obey the Law of the Pack.

The Cub Scout Salute (pg 34):

By touching your fingertips to your cap (or your right eyebrow if no cap) you show respect to your den leaders and when saluting the flag you show respect to your country.

Webelos (pg 32):

Webelos (say WE-buh-lows) is a Cub Scout secret. Cub Scouts know the secret. It is WE’II BE Loyal Scouts.
